# **CHARGING AND REMISSIONS POLICY**

## **OVERVIEW**

The governors of Anchorsholme Academy will make a charge for some of the activities taking place in school. Our policy on this is as follows –

## **OBJECTIVES**

To make clear what will be provided without charge and what will be offered with a charge being made.

### **No charge will be made for the following –**

Admissions to the academy and education within school hours  
Provision of all learning materials connected to the national curriculum  
Sporting events/activities and transport to and from these events/activities  
School meals for children entitled to free school meals.

### **Charges will be made for the following –**

Cost of day visits for events and any related travel costs

Cost of specialist visitors to the academy

Transport on the school minibuses will be charged to the year groups for all day trips

Current cost of the day trips is £15 per year – no additional costs will be incurred by the parents for school trips or visits.

Travel, board and lodgings for residential visits

Cost of individual or group music tuition delivered by specialists within school hours

Any cost related to the wilful breakage or damage of school property

Where parents are in receipt of benefit based free school meals we will subsidise residential visits and not make a charge for school visits and events.

It is the Governors' policy that charging for these activities where permissible should be left to the discretion of the Headteacher but that as a general principle, as at present, charges will not normally be levied in respect of school based activities, there will be no charge for the cost of ingredients and materials for food tasting and art, craft and design but parents may contribute to these on a voluntary basis.

## **OUTCOMES**

The funding of activities will be a clear and open process understood by all. We intend that our charging and remissions policy will be in line with that of the LA and that it will meet the requirements of the law.
