
Meanwhile, our Key Stage 2 students expanded their language skills by learning vocabulary and sentences related to school stationery, locations, weather, and numbers, linking their learning to dates and time.



Students taking part in the UK-China Online Student Exchange Programme have enjoyed a series of fun and interactive sessions this term. They focused on learning new vocabulary and sentence structures related to weekend activities. A highlight of the programme was a lively game of Charades: Chinese students guessed the actions of Anchorsholme pupils and responded in English, while our students watched their Chinese peers and replied in Mandarin. It was a fantastic way to build language skills through creativity, laughter, and teamwork.

The Mandarin Team has also brought creativity to life through a hands-on cultural craft activity introduced to our outreach schools: the ancient and beautiful technique of Tie-Dye, which has been used in various cultures for thousands of years.





In addition, the team continues to lead monthly craft sessions at the local Anchorsholme Library during the first week of each month. During the Spring term workshops, they taught the community how to create beautifully designed cards for special occasions, blending creativity with cultural appreciation.
